and visits one of the most famous ex-recording studios in London up in Highbury Park!

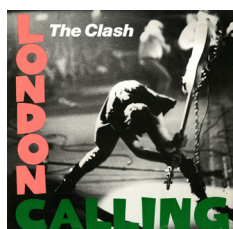
The studio was a Sunday School and one of the main recording areas a classroom. It became a studio in the 1960s and was variously owned by songwriter Les Reed and Chrysalis Records, and George Martin was a director for a time. The Sex Pistols recorded 'Never Mind the Bollocks' in 1977. The Clash 'London

Calling' two years later. Queen used the venue for 'Bohemian Rhapsody' and 'We Will Rock You'. The Rolling Stones, The Pretenders, King Crimson, REM, Tina Turner, David Bowie and countless others have all recorded there. 'Simply The Best', 'In The Court Of The Crimson King' and Enya - all in Highbury!

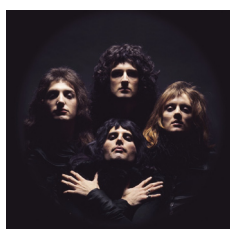
Start: Meet outside St Augustine's Church (108 Highbury New Park, N5 2DR). Please arrive for 10am sharp!
